#### **Going to France**

The coach, will be departing from Ludlow at 2 pm on the afternoon of Friday 26th May from Smithfield car park for the 23.00 crossing from Newhaven to Dieppe, with DFDS Ferries. Participants are advised to bring sandwiches and water or a flask. The coach has a toilet.

We expect to be in Rouen around 08.00. am.We shall stop in the Cathedral quarter where you can find cafes which are open at that time, such as le First Liberty in the Rue Aux Juifs and Columbus, and are both just two minutes away. We shall issue a short guide to Rouen on the coach so that you can easily find the most interesting things to do and places to visit. Just after lunch we shall leave Rouen, at a time to be announced on arrival, for the two hour journey via Sees and Argentan to La Ferté-Macé where our hosts will meet us.


